


Navigators:

- help appellants prepare for their hearing and explain what happens at the hearing



Adjudicative Tribunals in Canada – How Many with Navigational Tools?




COMPARISON - TRIBUNALS WITH & WITHOUT NAVIGATIONAL TOOLS
