A Seat at The Table: An Access to Justice Index for Self Presented Parties

Access to justice (A2J) for self-represented parties who appear before tribunals requires a lot of core ingredients to meet their distinct needs. Tribunals should consider the impact on self-represented parties when setting their table, from designing user-friendly systems to explaining the hearing process to releasing the decision. An effective way to do this is by engaging in on-going self-assessment of how Tribunals are serving the needs of those who represent themselves. SOAR has developed an A2J Self-Represented Parties Index as a utensil for tribunals to use in evaluating their processes to better serve A2J for self-represented parties. This workshop will present the index and explore its uses for ensuring that self represented parties will always have a seat at the table.

Just Desserts: Baking AI into Administrative Justice

Artificial intelligence (AI) is the latest ingredient to reshape the work of administrative tribunals and regulatory bodies. From streamlining internal processes like case management and legal research to supporting decision-makers and assisting self-represented litigants during hearings, AI is already influencing many aspects of the adjudicative process. At the same time, could these "artificial flavours" lead to potential administrative indigestion? Institutions must grapple with key concerns such as transparency, accountability, and bias in AI systems when setting their menu of options.

This panel will explore the evolving role of AI in administrative justice, examining both its potential benefits and the challenges it presents. It will discuss how tribunals and regulatory bodies can balance their diet by responsibly integrating AI tools while maintaining fairness, public confidence, and trust in the decision-making process.
