## **Challenging Topics**

- Three difficult subjects for an adjudicator:
  - 1. An unrepresented party
  - 2. Motions e.g. adjournment, disclosure, bias
  - 3. Whether or not there is a conflict of interest for a Panel Member

#### **Conflicts of Interest**

#### Conflicts of Interest:

- 1. Actual
- 2. Potential
- 3. Perceived
- Sometimes created by statute e.g. Police Services
   Act, membership on police services boards
- Perceived conflicts often lead to Bias Motions

#### 2. <u>Decision on Appeal to the Divisional Court</u>

- Dated February 13, 2012
- Moose Winooski's v. AGCO et al 2011 ONSC 543

#### 3. Set up of AGCO and Appeals

- Registrar of AGCO issued a Notice of Proposal to suspend licensee's Liquor License for 45 days due to a specific event
- Licensee appealed the Notice of Proposal
- At the time, appeals from decisions of the Registrar were heard by the Board of the AGCO
- The Registrar and the CEO of the AGCO were the same person
- The CEO reported to the Board

- The hearing regarding the Notice of Proposal appeal is on-going
